The lab has a wide variety of software programs that appeal to different learning styles and tastes. An instructor is always available to assist. The student, instructor and computer work together as a team to customize a unique instructional plan for each student. While students work to increase basic academic skills, they build computer literacy through hands-on work using a variety of computer formats.

The CALC is open Mondays through Thursdays 8am through 3pm and Fridays, 8am to noon during the August through May school year. Evening hours are Monday, Tuesdays and Thursdays 5pm to 7:30pm.

A six week summer session runs two days (morning) per week, Tuesdays & Thursdays.
